POLICY ON SELLING CBD OIL AT THE KCC & WFEH:

- Vendor's can sell CBD oil as long as the package clearly indicates by the manufacturer
 the amount of THC and it is within the legal limits, then it is fine for a vendor in leased
 space to sell CBD oil.
- Legal limit for the state of Tennessee is 0.3.
- The manufacturer's label must state the THC level not the vendor.
- A vendor having signage to this effect in their booth is NOT enough
- Each bottle/package has to have this stated in print on the individual container that is being sold.
- The vendor needs to be able to demonstrate that they can legally sell the product in Tennessee. (The best way to do that is through the manufacturer's label) So, if a vendor is here from Colorado or California, which has different laws, they may not be able to sell that product to a resident of Tennessee.
- State law says that "marijuana" does not include oil containing CBD with less than 0.9% THC if the "bottle containing the oil <u>is labeled by the manufacturer</u> as containing CBD in an amount less than nine-tenths of one percent (0.9%) of THC"
- Vendors can only sell CBD oil that is labeled as "THC Free". They cannot sell or advertise to sell any other products containing CBD oil that do not say THC Free.
